Please note that all facilities that use or possess the chemicals listed above, or any other chemical that exceeds the minimum reporting threshold, these chemicals are a reportable substance under the Vermont Community Right-to-Know Program. If you exceed the minimum threshold of storage you will need to complete a Tier II inventory form and submit it to the address listed above. If you are required to pay a fee, as defined in Vermont Statute 20 VSA, Chapter 1, the fee needs to accompany the Tier II form. All chemicals listed above are subject to reporting under either Sections 302, 304, 311, and 312 of SARA.
