Principles of Emergency Management (IS230)
January 31 – February 1, 2007



The Maine Emergency Management Agency will be conducting the Federal Emergency Management Agency training program titled *Principles of Emergency Management*. This 2-day course is part of the Professional Development Series (PDS) of courses developed under the supervision of the Emergency Management Institute (EMI) with the assistance of State and local subject-matter experts.

This course will provide the student with an introduction to the fundamentals of the emergency management system. Course topics will include the four phases of the emergency management cycle, community-focused hazard analysis, and the connection between planning and emergency management. The student will be introduced to the core functions of an emergency management program, as well as the day-to-day program functions, including the roles of emergency management participants. A final examination will be administered at the end of the program. IS230 course has been awarded 1.0 CEUs.

Target Audience: County and local emergency management directors and their deputies only please.

Mike Grant from MEMA will serve as primary instructor and course manager.

Course Location: The course will be held at Jeff's Catering in Brewer, ME. Classes will run from 8:15 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. daily. Lunch and breaks will be provided all other expenses are the responsibility of the student.
