DATE: **Wednesday July 12, 2006 thru Sunday July 16, 2006

LOCATION: Brattleboro Fire Department, Brattleboro, VT

Course Overview: This 2-day, 16-hour course includes hands-on practical exercises using radiological survey instruments. The MERRTT program was developed by DOE as a nationwide program to ensure training consistency in responding to transportation incidents involving radioactive material. MERRTT exclusively covers Hazard Class 7 radioactive material and builds on information taught in other hazardous material courses. MERRTT is designed to provide emergency responders with the fundamental knowledge and skills required to respond with confidence to incidents involving radioactive material.

Target Audience: Fire/Rescue/HAZMAT personnel, Law Enforcement officers, EMS, 911 Center personnel, Industrial and Hospital engineering/radiation safety officers, Emergency Room in-service coordinators, and state Health Department trainers are encouraged to attend the training.

The MERRTT program has been approved by the Continuing Education Coordinating Board of Emergency Medical Services (CECBEMS) for Continuing Education Hours (CEH). The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) has accepted MERRTT and placed into the listing of federal training courses.

Cost: All training and course materials are free of charge.

Acceptance Notification: Applicants will receive acceptance letters via email. If an email address is not provided the acceptance letter will be faxed. Vermont residents will be given first priority.
